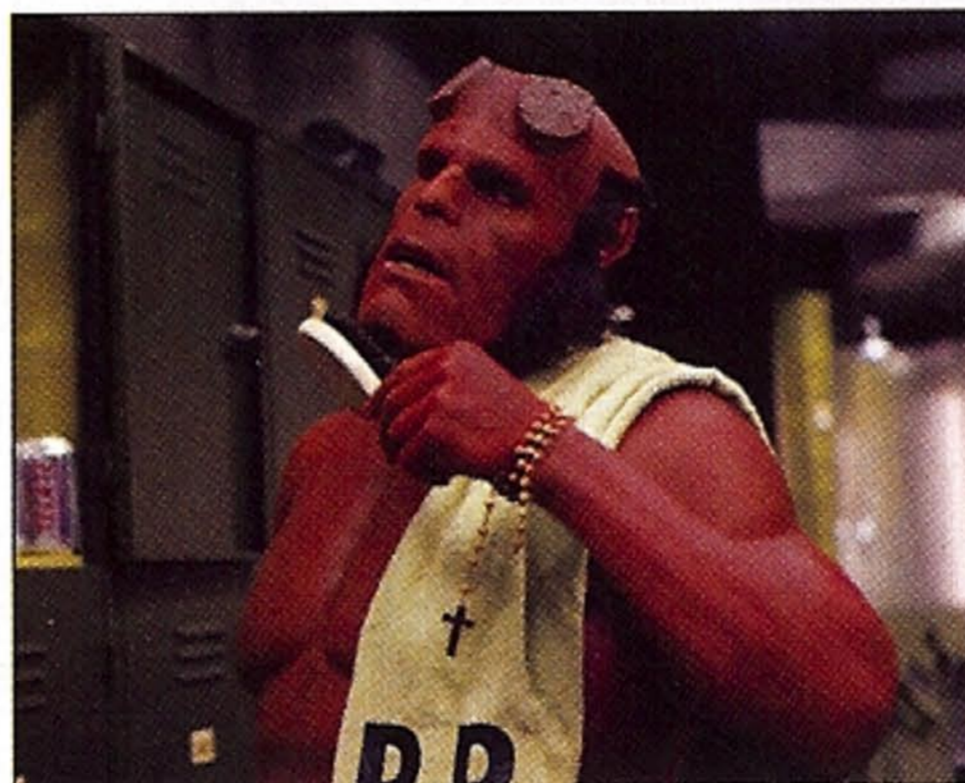
MAN ON WIRE AT CINEWORLD

SCHOOLS GO TO THE MOVIES

Free film screenings for schoolchildren **film education** will be held in all Cineworld sites across the UK as part of National Schools Film Week. Taking place from 20-24 October in England, Wales and Northern Ireland (and from 3-7 November in Scotland), this year's NSFW is set to be the biggest ever, with around 320,000 schoolchildren in attendance. The programme will include a wide variety of films for both primary and secondary schools. Titles include *The Spiderwick Chronicles*, *The Chronicles of Narnia: Prince Caspian*, *WALL•E*, *Son of Rambow*, *The Kite Runner*, *Persepolis* and *Juno*. The second Canary Wharf Film Festival runs from 28-31 August, and will be returning to Cineworld



West India Quay again this year. The Festival will also be screening at Museum in Docklands and Canary Wharf's East Wintergarden. CWFF 08 aims to showcase the finest in short film, documentary, animation and music video from UK and worldwide talent. Meanwhile, the Chichester International Film Festival is now in its 17th year and has become a staple in the summer diet of the South Coast Community. Complementing other popular local events (such as the Goodwood Festival of Speed, the Real Ale and Jazz Festival, Jazz in the City and the Blues & Roots Festival), the Film Festival proudly represents the art of film. It annually presents over 80 premieres, previews, new releases and retrospectives, plus illustrated talks, visiting filmmakers and Q&As – all in the space of 18 days.

The Festival begins with a free open air screening of the classic *High Society* in the grounds of Chichester Cathedral, and ends with a closing gala at Chichester Cinema at New Park – presenting the UK premiere of *Conversations with my Gardener*.
